Dani loves the nectar of a wide variety of flowers including Canada goldenrod (Solidago canadensis) and will consume a lot of it to build up fat reserves and be able to do her long migration.

AN ENDANGERED ICON

Unfortunately, since 2023, Monarch butterflies have been recognized and listed by the Government of Canada as "Endangered" under the federal Species at Risk Act (SARA) due to loss of habitat, misuse of pesticides and climate change.


