Bee species come in a variety of body shapes and sizes, and even have tongues of different lengths!

HONEY BEES ARE NOT NATIVE TO CANADA

Honey bees were imported from Europe almost 400 years ago and continue to be managed for honey production and pollination services.



Most bee species live a solitary life. A minority are social and form colonies or nest in aggregations.

They nest in different habitats, including in wood, in stems, or underground, making use of old rodent burrows or dense thatches.
